

What can I learn at CDS?

MA students learn to engage in cross-disciplinary projects through research conducted across various areas, implemented both in individual work and collective processes. This practice-oriented approach issues in students' final projects, which comprises a practical part and a written thesis. Through seminars, excursions, workshops, guest lectures and close mentorship, the MA program aims to prepare graduates for critical work within global interest groups combining different specialist backgrounds.

HOW TO APPLY?

In order to apply, you have to submit a written application. After your application materials have been reviewed by the admission committee, candidates will be invited to fulfill a practical test, which will be followed by an interview held in Vienna.

Phase 1

Registration and submission

Register for the online application process under https://application.uni-ak.ac.at/ and upload all requested documents in one single PDF file (max. 50 MB) between 8 and 22 January 2026, 13:00 MEZ.

The PDF shall be named: 'LastName_FirstName_MA_Application'

The requested documents are:

- a) Copy of degree certificate(s)
- b) Curriculum Vitae (CV)
- c) Portfolio (max. 20 pages): documentation of academic, artistic and/or practical work; documentation of your bachelor's project.
- d) Project draft (max. 500 words): your idea for a Master's thesis, taking into account the specific cross-disciplinary character of such an endeavor. You are not obliged to implement the idea you present here.
- e) Motivation letter (max. 500 words), which should include:
 - information about your previous studies of art and other academic subjects;
 - project experience and collaborative work within and beyond your previous degree program;
 - your expectations of the CDS Master's program.

Phase 2

Practical task and interview

Applicants who have passed phase 1 of the admission process will be invited for a personal interview conducted by the admission committee. Interviews will be held in Vienna between **23 February and 6 March 2026.** They are based on the submitted documents and a practical task preceding the interview.

Results

Publication of results by 13 March 2026

Studies commence in the winter semester following the entrance exam.

Evidence of English proficiency at level B2 (CEFR) is required and will be checked by the Office for Student and Academic Affairs after you have passed the entrance exam.
