Bachelor Programme: Admission Information for 2025/26

A prerequisite for admission to the TransArts bachelor degree programme is the determination of artistic aptitude in the framework of an **entrance examination**.

The examination consists of two parts and is used to assess exceptional visual talent and the ability to combine this talent with other creative or cognitive skills.

First part:Assessment of the submitted portfolio and supporting documentsSecond part:Practical work on a posed topic, personal interview

Upon registration, the following must be submitted:

- a portfolio of artistic sample work,
- a curriculum vitae, and
- a letter of motivation in which personal expectations for the programme are explained.

Portfolio

- PDF document of 50 MB max. Additional files (e.g. videos) can be linked from this document if required (e.g. vimeo allows a password protected video upload).
- the portfolio should document the current state of your artistic approach in the medium of your choice. There are no boundaries to the scope or topics of the work, whereby the aspect of topicality in connection with contemporary art and its discourse is an important criteria.
- content: e.g. project ideas, visualised concepts, drawings, photography, videos, documentation of threedimensional work, documentation of performances, etc.

Estimated Dates of the entrance examination for the Academic Year 2025/26

15. to 29.1.2025, 12 noon (CET): Registration and submission of portfolio and supporting documents > www.dieangewandte.at/entry (update in autumn 2024)

31.1.2025: Announcement of candidates admitted to the second part of the examination

24. to 27.2.2025: Second part of the entrance examination

14.3.2025 at the latest: Announcement of the results

The second part of the entrance examination is preferably held in presence.

Admission to studies in the subsequent winter semester

Upon successful completion of the entrance examination, admission to studies ensues in the subsequent winter semester (approx. mid-September 2025).
