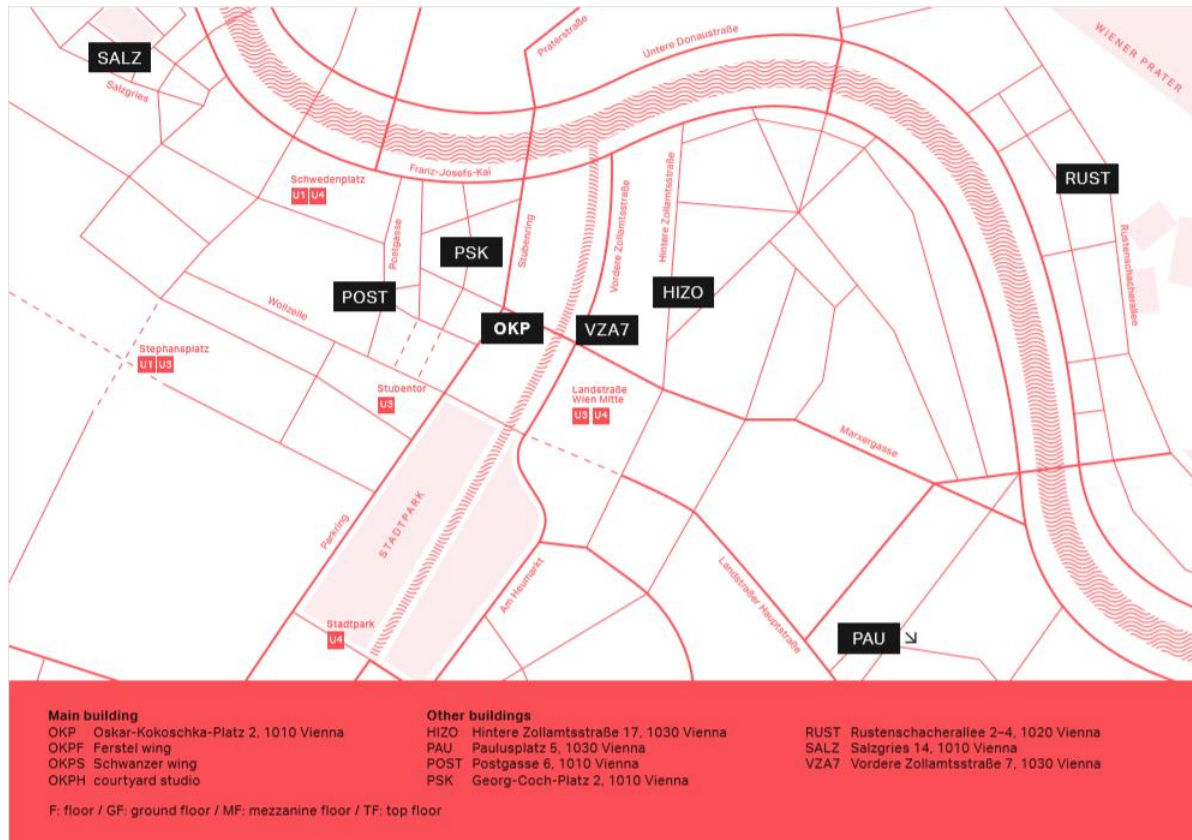

COURSE REGISTRATION | GRADING

You cannot register for courses before your admission as a student at Angewandte, which means, you cannot register before mid of September in winter semester and not before mid of February in summer semester. See admission (window).



GENERAL INFORMATION

- Being accepted for a study programme at the Angewandte means that you are **automatically eligible to participate in the main artistic course** of that programme.
- In most of our curricula, the **main artistic course is called *Zentrales künstlerisches Fach (ZkF)***. Art Education and a few others though have no artistic major. You can attend one main artistic course per semester in which you are expected to participate.
- You have to perform your main artistic course in your department but you can **essentially visit electives in any other department, given there is a free spot and it is part of your study programme (e.g Painting = Institute: Fine Arts) or it is open for co-registration (see curriculum allocation below every course)**.
- **We do not have a statutory programme** per level | per semester | per year.
- There are **no separate courses for exchange students nor is there any course list to choose from**. Like any other student of the Angewandte, you can choose your courses individually. Most of the departments offer recommendations for exchange students, though. Therefore: Be at the kick-off meeting of your department at the beginning of the semester.
- In principal, exchange students are eligible for co-registration (*Mitbelegung*) at other Austrian universities, meaning that you can attend their classes. **However, not all universities allow this, e.g., the University of Vienna**. Before applying for co-registration, please check in with your International Office back home. **Courses attended at other universities will not appear in your official transcript from Angewandte.**

COURSE-SELECTION

- To search and choose your courses, you do not have to log in.
- Go to our BASE website (base.uni-ak.ac.at/courses), choose semester -> choose your programme out of *all study programmes* -> choose the subject group out of *curriculum*

subjects. To choose courses outside of your programme: Similar procedure as above but you have to watch out for „co-registration possible“(-> all study programmes)

- Detailed course information (examination modalities, co-registration, curriculum allocation, ECTS, etc.) is provided in the description of each course. **Please note: diploma study programmes are divided into 1. section (= BA-level) and 2. section (= MA-level).**
- Be aware that course descriptions are available in English only if teaching staff provided English texts. Note: Not all courses can be held in English.

REGISTRATION FOR COURSES

- **It is unfortunately not possible to register to courses online prior to your personal admission at the Angewandte** (-> see *Admission at Angewandte*).
- **You will receive your login data via automated e-mail from the Student Office when your registration process is finished.** This allows you to register to courses.
- You cannot register to two artistic majors or two similar electives in the same semester.
- **It is not possible to attend a course (base.uni-ak.ac.at/courses) without prior online registration.**
- You receive a confirmation by e-mail as soon as the teacher approved your registration. Sometimes your subscription is pending. If you do not receive a confirmation for a long time, get in touch with the International Office or attend the first meeting.
- Registration to courses grants you access to the nextCloud course folder and allows you to integrate course dates into your personal calendar. Changes done by teachers will automatically appear in your calendar. Furthermore, you will receive all informative e-mails that teachers send to the group of course participants.

Your **Learning Agreement** is a contract between all parties involved in your exchange (the sending institution, the receiving institution and, of course, yourself). It has to be prepared in order to ensure that all parties agree on the academic goals and achievements during your time abroad. In order to facilitate this process, the Learning Agreement has to be filled out and signed digitally/online IN TIME.

Prepare your OLA after you have been accepted as an exchange student at the University of Applied Arts Vienna. As courses will still be planned, we ask you to create a tentative OLA, which will be amended after your arrival.

Changes | Learning Agreement – During the Mobility

It is very common to make changes during your stay, so no cause to worry about your Learning Agreement - Before the Mobility. Should students need to make changes to their course

selection during their stay, they can fill in the changes through the same system.

- If the host university did not sign online then students need to make a completely new Learning Agreement for their changes.
- If the host university signed online then students can choose to “Apply Changes” and add or delete courses.
- It is important to fill in Table B if there are changes to know how the courses will be recognized at the home institution.
- Once everything is ready, the student signs the OLA online and the agreement is automatically sent to the responsible person at both universities.

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS | LEARNING GERMAN

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS



- **We do not request a language certificate.**
Nevertheless, we **strongly recommend a basic knowledge of German**, as the **general teaching language** at our university is **German**. For Communication Design, Language Arts, Stage Design, Studies in Arts and Culture and Expanded Museum Studies, a German level of B2 is obligatory.
- **We expect a profound knowledge of English (B2) from all students** because in most departments English is commonly used as working language. There are study programmes offered in English (e.g. Art & Science, Cross-Disciplinary Strategies, Architecture, Social Design, Transformation Studies. Art X Science), all of which require knowledge of **English on a academic level** (min. C1). We do not offer English courses though.
- **Theory classes (excl. English speaking programmes) are hard to follow without a substantial knowledge of German.**
- We recommend attending a **German course** before and during your exchange in Vienna. Erasmus+ students will be registered for the Online Language Support (OLS) by their home university.
- **A German course for a cheaper price is offered** by the International Office **during the semester**. Please note: **As this course is not part of any of our curricula and is held at Innes Institute (innesvienna.net), you will not receive any credits (ECTS) for your official Angewandte's Transcript of Records but your home university may recognize the certificate of 6 ECTS. Please ask back at your home institution.**

Post address is the one in Vienna and home address the one you are reachable (when you are not in Vienna (anymore))



PAYMENT OF THE STUDENT UNION FEE

After the processing of your admission application (which can take up to 14 days especially at the beginning of the admission period) the Office for Student Affairs (Student Office) will get in touch with you via e-mail to forward payment details for the transfer of your Student Union fee | ÖH-Beitrag of € 24,70 (oeht.at/service/oeht-beitrag).

PLEASE NOTE: We do not recommend enquiries before 14 days have passed since this only delays the processing.

- **Please transfer the exact amount of € 24,70 with the reference number** (which you have received from the Office for Student Affairs). It is recommended to use the included QR-

code. If you are located in a country with another currency, you must still transfer the exact amount, otherwise our Office for Student Affairs cannot proceed.

- If you struggle with transferring the Student Union fee, please contact the International Office. You can also open a banking account on a transfer app like wise.com.

Without completing admission (winter semester by end of October, summer semester by end of March) you are not eligible to attend courses (base.uni-ak.ac.at/courses) or take exams of the respective term. This also applies to extended exchange students!



ONLINE SERVICES | REGISTRATION TO COURSES

- After receiving the Student Union fee | ÖH Beitrag on the account of the university (bank transfers can last **up to 4 days**) you will receive the **login details** for your student account. This is where you will find your 'Studienbestätigung' (=confirmation of enrollment) - dieangewandte.at/online_services_en. See Exchange Guide: Online Services
- All courses at the Angewandte can be accessed through the base: base.uni-ak.ac.at/courses. Online registration requires login through your student account.

PLEASE NOTE

If after 4 days you have not received a confirmation about the successful admission to your degree programme, please get in touch with the Student Office: studien@uni-ak.ac.at.

ATTENTION: Attending courses without registration is NOT possible, also to artistic majors.



BUILDING ACCESS CARD | STUDENT ID

- After admission our facility manager (Angelika Pawlik) receives a notification. After processing your data, you can pick up your **building access card at the porter's lodge at the entrance to our main building at Oskar-Kokoschka-Platz 2, 1010 Vienna**. If you do not receive your card on the first try, please try again. The whole process can take up to 10-14 business days after admission. Still, you will not receive the card before the semester starts. If you have not received the card by mid of October or mid of March, please let the International Office know. The card lasts until the end of the semester including the holidays. **Please return the plastic cards to the porter's lodge at the end of your stay. Note that our porter may not speak English, so it is recommended to take a German speaking person with you.**
- If desired, students can collect their student ID at the Office for Student Affairs after successful admission. Please bring your valid ID copy and a coloured picture (**3,5 x 4,5 cm**) to the infodesk (opening hours: Tue, Thu, 10-12h, Wed, 13-15h). You can again pick up your Student ID at our Student Office after 2-3 working days: **Please write an e-mail to studien@uni-ak.ac.at**. For (cheaper) access as a student to museums, etc., you may also get an Erasmus-Student-Network-card (esnuniwien.com/esncard) for 15€ or an International Student Identity-card (isic.org) for 18€.

ENTRANCE TO AND RESIDENCE IN AUSTRIA

Residence registration in Vienna: within 3 days after arrival.

Residence registration in Austria: within 90 (-max. 120) days after arrival.

Residence deregistration in Vienna: within 3 days after departure.



RESIDENCE REGISTRATION IN VIENNA

UPON ARRIVAL

Within 3 working days of your arrival in Austria, you have to do your Residence Registration (compulsory registration), either as a main resident or a secondary resident.

NOTE: If you register as a main resident, you will need to deregister or secondary register in the country you lived before, so registering as a secondary resident in Vienna is recommended.

You **can register** at any of the Municipal Registration Service Centres (*Meldeamt*) in any of the Vienna District Offices (*Magistratisches Bezirksamt*):

BEFORE LEAVING

You are required to **deregister within 3 working days before or after you left**. You can deregister at any of the Registration Service Centres

(*Meldeamt*) in one of the Vienna District Offices (*Magistratisches Bezirksamt*) or via mail but you have to hand in the Original *Meldezettel* and a passport or EU-ID copy. **If you forget to deregister, it might cost you up to € 700!**

Confirmation of Registration (*Anmeldebescheinigung*)

You have to attach photocopies of the following documents with the personally signed [application form](#) to the application. Make sure to only show the original documents:

- Valid ID card or passport
- Proof of [health insurance](#) covering all risks (e.g. European Health Insurance Card, insurance policy, student insurance (*Studierendenselbstversicherung*))
- Proof of sufficient financial means, e.g. savings book or bank account, traveller's cheques (depending on the individual case)
- confirmation/notification of admission from the university

Translation of documents: It is recommended not only to have public documents notarized but also to have them translated, as the residence authority may require this based on statutory provisions. Certain public documents issued by an EU country do not need to be certified or translated. In this case, a translation can be skipped if the public document is accompanied by a multilingual standard form, which has to be attached to the document by the authority of the issuing country. English documents may therefore be accepted. The authority may demand further documents depending on the individual case.

VISA FOR NATIONALS OF THIRD COUNTRIES

A **Visa D** entitles you to enter and stay in Austria. It can be granted for a duration from **91 days to 6 months**. Holders of a Visa D also enjoy freedom of movement to other Schengen countries for up to 90 days provided that they fulfil the general entry conditions. If you need a Visa for more than 180 days, please get in touch with the International Office. You have to apply for the visa in person at the competent [Austrian representative authority](#) (embassy, consulate with power to issue visa) **in your country of residence** before travelling to Austria. The visa will then be issued by that authority. In the [checklist](#) you will find a list of all documents that are required for an application.

GETTING AROUND

Note: If online booking does not work, just go to one of the Wiener Linien shops: The closest to Angewandte is at Landstrasse / Wien Mitte (U3/U4/S/CAT). It is only 3€ more.

Are you 26 or older?

Do not despair, you can purchase a [regular yearly ticket](#): One-time booking on the 4th business day at the start of the validity period or monthly booking in 12 instalments on the 4th business day of each month. You can cancel the ticket at any point, but you will have to present proof that you are leaving Vienna (e.g., your deregistration). You may also have to pay an extra fee. Alternatively, you can buy a [monthly ticket](#) (31 days, flexible start date).

GOING BY (E-)BIKE OR E-SCOOTER

Going by bicycle is common and bike lanes are fairly established in Vienna. You may find a second-hand bike here: willhaben.at. In springtime watch out for bike flea markets. If you are in need to DIY-repair your bike or look for a cheap bike: fahrrad.wuk.at, bikekitchen.net or flickerei.at/flickerei-fahrradselbshilfewerkstatt. Are you in need of a transport bike: graetzlrاد.wien/bike/3rad or fahrrad.wuk.at/angebote/lastentransport. If you do not want to buy an (e-)bike, you may rent one with a student discount (from € 12,90/month) with swapfiets.at/en-AT/vienna.

WIEN MOBIL RAD STATIONS (Bike Sharing)

WienMobil Rad is an environment-friendly way of public transport. Bikes can be hired at over 120 bike stations across Vienna. They can be returned at any empty bikebox at any station. Available around the clock, the whole year. You pay 0,60€ per 30min or 14,90€ for 24hrs. If you are a holder of a Wiener Linien long-term ticket, it costs half the price: stadt-wien.at/freizeit/sport/radfahren/city-bike-wien.html

E-SCOOTER & MOTOR SCOOTER SHARING SYSTEMS

You may borrow one of the following providers li.me/en-de, voi.com and bird.co the most common ones. Please take care regarding your safety. There is also a provider for motor scooters in Vienna: at.go-sharing.com

GOING BY CAR | TAXI

If you plan on coming to Vienna by car, please make sure to find a spot to stay. You may buy yourself a ticket for **park & ride garages** (min. 4,40€ per day, see websites for monthly rates): parken.at. Since March 2022 all districts in Vienna became **short-term parking zones** which can become quite pricey (1h = € 2,60). If you only stop for less than **15min, it is for free. You can get the free 15min-tickets (purple) in every kiosk (Trafik)**. You can buy tickets in kiosks (*Trafik*) or easily book these tickets via mobile app: handyparken.at.

CAR SHARING & CABS

You can register for car sharing in Vienna with Share Now: share-now.com (from 0,31€/min) or gomore.at. The usual way to order a taxi in Vienna (which is safe) is to **stop it in the street side or to call +43 1 31100 or +43 1 40100** (also apps available). The private run services uber.com and bolt.eu are available via Mobile App.

GOING BY TRAIN | BUS

If you come and go by train or want to get to know more about Austria, please check out the Austrian Federal Train Service (*Österreichische Bundesbahn*): oebb.at (or the westbahn.at)
The *Österreichische Bundesbahn* also have **interesting offers** like the

- *Einfach-raus-ticket* (2-5 people for € 37-49): oebb.at/de/tickets-kundenkarten/freizeit-urlaub/einfach-raus-ticket or with bicycle (2-5 people for € 46-58)

Little hint: If you book cross-border trips, you may also check the given websites of the country you travel to. The same ticket might be cheaper there.

The **Vienna International Busterminal sits in Vienna-Erdberg** from where you have a connection with the metro (U3) into town. You can purchase bust tickets via flixbus.at or tickets.vib-wien.at/en

GOING BY PLANE

You find heaps of offers and comparing websites for getting to Vienna by plane (e.g. skyscanner.at) online. To get into town from the airport, the easiest way is to take the **S7** (schnellbahn-wien.at/web/flughafen-wien-schwechat.html) or the **REX-trains from the Viennese airport which is located in Vienna-Schwechat**. The City Airport Train is a bit faster but pricey (cityairporttrain.com). There are also cheap connections via bus (approx. 1h) from or to the nearby airport in Bratislava, Slovakia.

HOUSING

The main buildings of our university are located in the 1st district ("Innere Stadt" | Inner City) in Vienna. The 2nd district ("Leopoldstadt") and 3rd district ("Landstrasse") are nearby as well. But as long as your accommodation is close to a metro or tram station, every other district is fine as well and the university is within easy reach. **We have no on-site accommodation. Public transport in Vienna is reliable and very well established. Also, going by bicycle is very common.** Last but not least, Vienna is a pretty safe city for living, but still - STAY SAFE!



STUDENT RESIDENCIES | DORMITORIES

Usually, you have to pay a deposit and have to stay for a certain time. If the proposed time period on their contract extends your planned stay, inform them that you are on exchange. Most agencies will alter the contract for you.

OeAD student housing (oeadstudenthousing.at) provides spots in their student residencies and small flats for recipients of OeAD grants, Erasmus students, in general (exchange) students and visiting professors. Please read the conditions and the FAQs carefully and apply online as soon as possible (registration fee: ca. € 35, deposit: rent price x 2). In the summer months they also rent out for short term stays. OeAD student housing now also has a cancellation insurance (only before your stay): oeadstudenthousinginsurance.com

APARTMENTS | SHARED FLATS

The advantage of choosing to rent or share a flat with other students is that you usually **do not have to pay commission fees (but a security deposit) plus it is really common for students here in Vienna.** It is advisable to be in Vienna whilst looking for a room but video interviews may work, too. **You will probably not find many options for a shared room earlier than 2 months upfront.** Sometimes we receive offers from our students | staff who have a room | apartment for rent, which we will forward to you. **In general, shared rooms cost between € 400-700 per month all inclusive**, single apartments start from approx. € 700-900 (incl. utility bills). **Regarding the monthly living costs, you may find orientation here:** studyinaustria.at/en/living/living-costs. **Please watch out for fake adverts online. If you are unsure about an offer or just want to recheck, do not hesitate to contact the International Office.**

MAINLY PRIVATE HOSTS CHEAPER, WEBSITES MOSTLY IN GERMAN

WORK PERMIT FOR THIRD COUNTRY NATIONALS

Third Country Nationals who are in possession of a residence permit for Austria are generally permitted gainful employment during their studies in Austria. The provisions of the Act Governing the Employment of Foreign Nationals have to be followed. Still, students who are nationals of third countries need a work permit for gainful employment.

Keep in mind: the successful course of studies may not be compromised by the job.

Students can get a work permit for employment (for students) for up to **20 hours weekly**. Full time employment is possible for all lecture-free periods. The work permit has to be applied for by the employer at the employment service (*Arbeitsmarktservice - AMS*) at least 6 weeks before the beginning of the employment. It is only valid for this specific job with the specific employer.

Please note: A work permit is also necessary for minimum income work (*geringfügige Beschäftigung*). You do not need a work permit for an unpaid internship (up to 3 months) but you still have to be registered at the employment service (*Arbeitsmarktservice - AMS*) by the employer at least 4 weeks beforehand. Please always update yourself on that topic as regulations may change.

HEALTH INSURANCE

In general, contact your insurance agency at your home country about your health coverage abroad.

EUROPEAN HEALTH INSURANCE CARD | EHIC (EUROPEAN STUDENTS)

- The European Health Insurance Card is recognized in most European countries.
- The distribution of the European Health Insurance Card may differ from country to country.
- The European Health Insurance Card is only valid at healthcare providers covered by the health insurance scheme provided for by law in Austria (*Kassenarzt/-ärztin*). If you go to a private doctor or establishment, you will not be able to use (or only partially) your European Health Insurance Card.

IF YOU DO NOT HAVE HEALTH INSURANCE OR ARE IN NEED OF ADDITIONAL COVERAGE

- The **Student Health Insurance Basic** is an **all-risk** student health insurance: feelsafe.at
- **Expat Insurance** – tailor-made (health) insurance plans, also for study cancellation: expatinsurance.eu

- **Care Austria Health Insurance** (care-concept.de/krankenversicherung/care_austria) is made to meet the special needs of foreign nationals in Austria.

ACCIDENT & LIABILITY INSURANCE

When going on exchange, in addition to your health insurance, you also need accident and liability insurances. Luckily this is covered by our semester fee as soon as you are officially enrolled: oeh.ac.at/en/study-2/insurance/. Note that the coverage applies only on campus or field-trips. No deductibles have to be paid. Besides that private liability insurance is recommended, if you are not e.g. co-insured with your parents.

MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORT (short-term support)

Going abroad can be a troubling situation. Therefore, our university offers **short-term mental support** regarding problems, conflicts and crisis related to work and personal issues. (e.g.: conflicts in your study environment and/or work restrictions, uncertainties and anxiety - also with regard to the planning of your future, stressful mental states and addiction problems).

The service is made possible in cooperation with the Association for Psychotherapy and supported by the ÖH Helpline. It is available to students of the Angewandte. The counselling takes place twice a week on site at the Angewandte.

HISTORY AND EDUCATIONAL ASSIGNMENT

FROM THE IMPERIAL ROYAL ARTS AND CRAFTS SCHOOL TO THE "ANGEWANDTE" OF TODAY

In the heart of Vienna, the capital of the Danube monarchy, the predecessor institution of the current University of Applied Arts, the Imperial Royal Arts and Crafts School, was founded in 1867. It was closely affiliated with the Imperial Royal Austrian Museum of Art and Industry (today the MAK), the first Arts and Crafts museum on the European continent. It was established in 1863 following the example of the South Kensington Museum in London, now the Victoria & Albert Museum, and was to serve as a collection of models for artists, industrialists, and the general public. At the time, early-industrialised England played a pioneer role in supporting a reformed Arts and Crafts movement in order to prevent its decline in the "Machine Age". In the spirit of Historicism, the aim was to make it possible, also in Vienna, to study the great styles of the past by example of Arts and Crafts objects in the museum and to set up a place of advanced education for designers and craftsmen with the Arts and Crafts School in Vienna. It should train artists and teachers in equal measure to serve the demands of the "art industry".

Heinrich von Ferstel, the architect of the museum building, was commissioned with the design for a separate building for the school. In 1877, the main building of our university, still in use to the day, was festively opened at its prominent location on the Ringstraße. In contrast to the Academy of Fine Arts, female students were allowed to study there from the very beginning. Gustav Klimt was but one of the numerous graduates from this era.

Along with the artistic development towards nature observation and free design, a break with work on the basis of historical precedents also took place at the Arts and Crafts School around the end of the nineteenth century. In 1899, Felician von Myrbach, a member of the newly-formed Viennese artists society Secession, was appointed as the director of the school, which was liberated from the administration of the museum in the following year. In Myrbach's term as director, there were numerous reforms and teacher appointments that made the Arts and Crafts School one of the birthplaces of Austrian Art Nouveau and founded its reputation as an

institution committed to the modern. As a member of the curatorial board, Otto Wagner played a significant role in the implementation of the reforms. The teaching staff at that time reads like a Who's-Who of the today highly regarded "Vienna around 1900" with names such as Kolo Moser, Josef Hoffmann, Alfred Roller - who began his highly influential term as director in 1909 - and students with the like of Oskar Kokoschka.

The end of the monarchy also meant the end of the "Imperial Royal" Arts and Crafts School, although Roller's long term in office (until 1934) ensured the continuity of the high standard of artistic quality. Franz Cizek realised an educational reform programme with his highly regarded youth art courses. From Cizek's course for theories of ornamental form emerged "Viennese Kinetism", which only recently has (again) attained its international art historical recognition, where female artists - such as Erika Giovanna Klien - set the tone for the first time. Architects like Josef Frank, Oskar Strnad, and Oswald Haerdtl continued the tradition of "Wiener Raumkunst" (Viennese Spatial Art) and transformed it. Margarete Schütte-Lihotzky, graduate of the Arts and Crafts School, went on to invent the first serially-produced so-called "Frankfurt Kitchen", which had a sustainable effect on social housing.

During the National Socialist regime, the Vienna Arts and Crafts School was under the direct supervision of the "Reichskammer der bildenden Künste" (Reich Chamber of Visual Arts), numerous teachers and students were banned from studies, threatened and persecuted, the teaching activities brought into line. The graphics class, in particular, under the direction of Paul Kirnig, delivered visual propaganda for the purposes of the "Third Reich", which contributed to the Arts and Crafts School's elevation to the "Reichshochschule für angewandte Kunst in Wien" (Reich College of Applied Arts in Vienna).

After 1945, the now "College of Applied Arts" had a difficult start under the direction of Maximilian Fellerer. Its orientation along the lines of an art academy was also reflected in the name "Academy of Applied Arts" (between 1948 and 1971, thereafter "College" again). The broadened scope of the educational programme, the increasing number of students, and an extension to the school along the Vienna Canal following the plans of Karl Schwanzer (1965) were signs of expansion in a new age of economic upswing.

Between 1979 and 1995 the "Angewandte" transformed into a progressive institution under the direction of Oswald Oberhuber and Rudolf Burger, who (briefly) guided the academy from 1995 to 1999. Amongst the teachers in the fields of architecture, design, fine art, and theory in these decades were personalities such as Friedrich Achleitner, Christian Ludwig Attersee, Carl Auböck, Wander Bertoni, Joseph Beuys (as guest lecturer), Rudolf Burger, Jean-Charles de Castelbajac, Tino Erben, Adolf Frohner, Peter Gorsen, Hans Hollein, Wilhelm Holzbauer, Alfred Hrdlicka, Wolfgang Hutter, Karl Lagerfeld, Maria Lassnig, Bernhard Leitner, Walter Lürzer, Axel Manthey, Paolo Piva, Wolf D. Prix, Christian Reder, Jil Sander, Sigbert Schenk, Kurt Schwarz, Johannes Spalt, Mario Terzic, Peter Weibel, Manfred Wagner - to name but a few.

If you like to read or have to do research, we can recommend the following big libraries. If you look for something more specific there are also heaps of little well-assorted libraries (e.g. the Sigmund Freud-library for Psychology). If you are in need of rare books, please look into the Central Directory of Antiquarian Books: zvab.com. Also support our local bookshops.

THINGS TO DO IN „NATURE“

WALKING | CYCLING | WEEKEND TRIPS

You find free walking tours here: wien.info/de/sehen-erleben/wien-entdecken/touren-guides/gratis-touren-347240. WienzuFuss offers walking cafés: wienzufuss.at/geh-cafe and has an app for your mobile device for walking tours by yourself: wienzufuss.at/app. Here you can plan your trips by bike in Vienna (fahrradwien.at/routenplaner) and within Austria (eurovelo.at/en). Bratislava, Prague or Budapest are not very far for weekend trips and the Semmering is the closest mountain to Vienna for walking tours and skiing.

VIENNA WOODS | LAINZER TIERGARTEN | STEINHOFGRÜNDE

Have a look around the vineyards at the Kahlenberg as well as the big Viennese woods. In fall you can drink Austrian young wine named “Sturm” which can make you quite drunk ;) . Here you find everything about the Heurigen-tradition: badvoeslau-tourismus.at/heurigen-abc. In the Lainzer Tiergarten (lainzer-tiergarten.at) you can either have a good hike, walk or just have a stroll around with friends or visit the Hermesvilla. The Steinhofgründe are a special spot in Vienna (stadtbekannt.at/spaziergaenge/ein-stueck-stadtgeschichte-die-steynhoftgruende), you can do sports, hang around in the sun or visit the Art Nouveau church of Otto Wagner. You can also visit a part of the dark history of Nazi Austria at the memorial: gedenkstaettesteinhof.at/en.

OPEN-AIR BATHING | INDOOR BATHING

Vienna has great water quality (even the tap water is indeed mountain water), so swimming in the Danube in the summertime can be real fun. Later in summer we would recommend the “Neue Donau” as the water is still the freshest. Ask locals for recommendations and take care, there may be strange people at some spots.

Bathing at the Danube island (“Donauinsel”): wien.gv.at/freizeit/baden/natur/donauinsel

Bathing at the Old Danube (“Alte Donau”): wien.gv.at/umwelt/gewaesser/alte-donau/erholung.

Bathing at more silent watery spots: wien.gv.at/freizeit/baden/natur/naturbadegewaesser or susi.at/blog/top-10-schwimmen-in-wien-geheimtipps. We also have a famous public bathing beach called “Gänsehäufel” (gaensehaeufer.at). It is an island with interesting architecture of the 1940s surrounded by the Old Danube. There you can have a swim in the Danube and in open-air swimming pools. If you want to experience something a bit outside of Vienna but easy to reach by city train S40 (Franz Joseph-Bahnhof), try a jump into the wild and cold Danube at “Strombad Kritzendorf”: klosterneuburg.at/Strombad_Kritzendorf. You may also check out the historic thermal open-air swimmingpool in Bad Fischau: fischauer-thermalbad.at. When it is too cold for outdoor swimming, have some fun at indoor swimming pools. Some of them even have really special architecture: theculturetrip.com/europe/austria/articles/10-of-viennas-best-indoor-swimming-pools. In the cold season Austria also offers really good spa

experiences, especially in Styria where we have thermal water deposits. One of the most stunning (but also very pricey) spas is the Rogner Therme Blumau designed by Friedensreich Hundertwasser (blumau.com). You may also find cheaper options in the Czech Republic or in Hungary.

VIENNESE CENTRAL CEMETERY

Vienna is known for its tendency to sarcastic morbidity, so a must-visit is one of Europe's biggest cemeteries: The Viennese Central Cemetery with its Art Nouveau church and all its graves of honours, with its Jewish history and the occasional wild animal (en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Vienna_Central_Cemetery). It even has a song dedicated to it by Wolfgang Ambros, *Es lebe der Zentralfriedhof*: youtube.com/watch?v=AoFnQ6hIG1w. Especially on November 1st, on All Saint's day, it is a very special Austrian tradition to visit your ancestors, so the cemeteries are basically packed with people.

- **VIENNA HAS MOUNTAIN SPRING WATER FROM THE TAB!** So there is no need to buy bottled water. If you order *Sodawasser* at a restaurant, it is tap water with gas.
- **RETHINK YOUR PURCHASE:** Do I really need this? Is it made well? Where is it made? Will it last a while? Is it energy efficient? Will it replace something less energy efficient? Can I repair it? Could I borrow it from someone? Who profits from it? How and where was it produced? How long does it spark joy? Can I live without it?
- **BUY AT OUR LOCAL DESIGNERS | DESIGN MARKETS:** e.g. stadt-wien.at/wien/maerkte/designmaerkte.html
- **BUY | SWOP | GET SECOND-HAND FOR FREE:** e.g. Austrian craig's list | ebay Kleinanzeigen: (willhaben.at), Parish fleamarkets (flohmarkt.at/flohmaerkte/wien/45), second-hand-shops by the catholic church (carla-wien.at), Vienna's collecting point of refuse-shop (48ertandler.wien.gv.at) or swop | get for free: kostnixladen.at. Search for the cheapest bargains for technical devices in local stores: geizhals.at
- **HOW TO GET SUSTAINABLE (AND AFFORDABLE) FOOD | COSMETICS | FASHION | LIVING:** Be part of a food-coop (*Solidarische Landwirtschaft*: foodcoops.at/bestehende-foodcoops) or take part in urban gardening (*Gemeinschaftsgarten*) garteln-in-wien.at/gemeinschaftsgaerten-und-nachbarschaftsgaerten or buy at our well-known (farmer) markets (wien.gv.at/freizeit/einkaufen/maerkte), use food-sharing (foodsharing.at) and have a look into crowdfarming (crowdfarming.com) or get your fresh eco box (Biokistl): umweltberatung.at/biokistl-anbieterinnen-aus-oesterreich. Also have a look at the website mundraub.org, where you can harvest fruit and veggies from ownerless plants for free. You can also find sustainable food brands in our supermarkets like *Zurück zum Ursprung*, *Ja! Natürlich*, *Natur*Pur*. If you need a nice present made of saved foods: unverschwendet.at or markta.at. To empower everyone to take action against food waste: toogoodtogo.de and not 1st class fruits and veggies: etepetete-bio.de. You may find sustainable cosmetics here: ecco-verde.at or ringana.com. Also have a look at avocadostore.at for fashion or at grueneerde.com, lamodula.at or fleamarkets for living items or our Klasse für alle: klassefueralle.uni-ak.ac.at
- **IF POSSIBLE, USE SUSTAINABLE TRAVELLING:** Fly as rarely as possible (avoid short distance & flight transfers), less luggage where possible, digital information is often sufficient, nearby destinations can also be exciting (e.g. Vienna per pedes: wienzufuss.at/app, use public transport and bicycles whenever possible. You can borrow transport bikes for free (see "GETTING AROUND)).
- **AVOID DIGITAL WASTE** As good as digitalization is and as it also helps us to react climate-friendly in a way, as important it is to also have the following in mind: Toxic metals of electronic devices lead to air-/soil-/water pollution, so maintain your electronics and donate or recycle your electronic gadgets, buy energy star rated electronics, delete data and e-mails which you do not read or need anymore (waste cloud). Documentary recommendation: welcome-to-sodom.de
- **LIVE GREEN:** Beautify your room | your studio with plants, turn off lights when not needed, turn off stand-by devices (multipoint plug with an on-off-button), rethink when you print, be a conscious user of our clean water, last but not least be a social, caring and kind person. You may volunteer, e.g. at caritas-wien.at or vinzi.at ☺

EXTENDING YOUR STAY

Extending your stay is possible from winter to summer semester. If you plan to “extend” your stay from summer to winter semester, you have to reapply through our system (deadline: 15. April). **Nevertheless, new applicants will always have priority to extending students!** Besides Angewandte’s requirements below, **please check back with your home institution** about a new acceptance letter, confirmation of stay (1 sem. / 2. sem.), transcript of records, extension paper, new learning agreement, etc.).

WHAT TO DO:

Step 1: Your department at the Angewandte and your home university both need to confirm the extension of the stay to our International Office via e-mail.

Step 2: Register once again at the Student Office, therefore you have to fill in the registration form once again (studien.homepage.uni-ak.ac.at/formulare/ZUL_RegistrationForm.pdf) and send it to studien@uni-ak.ac.at as soon as the general admission window is open.

Step 3: Pay your Student Union fee and register for courses after you are enrolled! **If you don’t pay the semester fee for the next semester, you will be exmatriculated!**

AFTER YOUR MOBILITY

You will receive your **Confirmation of Stay** through our Move On-system in an automated e-mail. If you need to get it signed differently, you may use:
